

THE RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF ARMSTRONG

BY-LAW NO. 05/17

Being a By-Law of the Rural Municipality of Armstrong to regulate activities at the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground.

WHEREAS Section 232(1) of "The Municipal Act", S.M. 1996, C.M225, provides in part; 232(1) A Council may pass by-laws for municipal purposes respecting the following matters:

- a) the safety, health, protection and well-being of people, and the safety and protection of property;
- b) people, activities and things in, or on near a public place or a place open to the public..."

AND WHEREAS Sections 232(2)(a) and (d) of "The Municipal Act" provides in part; 232(2) Without limiting the generality of subsection (1), a council may in a by-law passed under this Division;

- a) regulate or prohibit;...and
- b) establish fees or other charges for services, activities, or things provided or down by the municipality or for the use of property under the ownership, direction, management or control of the municipality.

AND WHEREAS it is deemed expedient and in the best interest of the Municipality to pass a by-law to regulate activities at the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground to plan, organize, control and supervise the transportation, treatment, handling, disposal, prevention, reduction, reuse or recycling of waste and the recovery of material, substances or energy from waste through the operation of the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Grounds.

NOW THEREFORE the Council of The Rural Municipality of Armstrong, in Council duly assembled, enacts as follows:

1. DEFINITIONS

Where used herein, the following words shall have the following meaning:

- a) **"Inwood Waste Transfer Station"** shall mean the Waste Transfer Site located at SE 34-17-1W on Transfer Station Rd 2W in Inwood, Manitoba.
- b) **"Chatfield Waste Transfer Station"** shall mean the Waste Transfer Site located at SW 7-21-1W on PR 419 in Chatfield, Manitoba.
- c) **"Meleb Waste Disposal Ground"** located at NW 15-20-2E on Rd 117N in Meleb, Manitoba.
- d) **"Person"** shall mean any individual and includes a corporation, firm, partnership, institution and association.
- e) **"Resident"** shall mean any individual who resides in or is the registered owner of real property in the Rural Municipality of Armstrong.
- f) **"Custodian"** shall mean the person or persons employed by the Municipality, from time to time, who are responsible for the operation and maintenance of the

Waste Disposal/Recycling at the Inwood & Chatfield Waste Transfer Stations and the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground.

2. HOURS OF OPERATION

The Inwood and Chatfield Waste Transfer Stations and Meleb Waste Disposal Ground shall be open and/or closed as per Schedule “C”

3. CLASSES OF WASTE

The following shall define, for the purposes of this By-Law, the classes of waste that may or may not be disposed of at the Inwood and Chatfield Waste Transfer Stations and the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground:

- a) **“Agricultural Waste”** shall mean excess materials derived from agricultural activities and, without limiting the generality of the foregoing, shall include, but is not limited to, crop residues, herbicides, pesticides, fertilizers, and like materials from all agricultural pursuits.
- b) **“Animal Waste”** shall mean animal, fish or fowl manure, excrement, carcasses or any part or mixtures thereof.
- c) **“Ashes”** shall mean the cold residue resulting from the burning of a substance.
- d) **“Combustible Waste”** shall mean, but is not limited to, tree boughs, stumps and branches, paper and cardboard products, wood and lumber and packaging materials derived from paper, cardboard and wood.
- e) **“Construction/Demolition Waste”** shall mean a mixture of waste building materials and rubble resulting from construction, remodelling, renovations, repairs, demolition or fire in building and other structures and includes, but is not limited to, lumber, plaster, concrete, drywall, glass, siding electrical and plumbing fixtures and piping or any combination thereof. Construction/Demolition Waste maybe reclassified as Ashes, Combustible, Excavation, Metallic or Recyclable Wastes provided said Construction/Demolition Waste is separated as per Classifications defined in this Section.
- f) **“Domestic Waste”** shall mean those wastes as listed in Schedule “B” to this by-law, as may be amended by the Council from time to time.
- g) **“Excavation Waste – Clean Fill”** shall mean natural soil, earth, sand, gravel, or any parts or mixtures thereof.
- h) **“Excavation Waste – Rubble”** shall mean asphalt, concrete, stone and non-burnable building materials, or any parts or mixtures thereof.
- i) **“Hazardous Waste”** shall mean a substance that is designated a hazardous waste by regulation under “The Dangerous Goods Handling and Transportation Act”.
- j) **“Industrial Waste”** shall mean solid and liquid waste materials resulting from, or incidental to, the manufacture, processing, or like operations of factories, processing plants, industrial processes and manufacturing operations and includes waste such as putrescible waste from food processing plants and rendering plants and condemned foods and products.
- k) **“Landfill Waste”** shall mean all discarded waste but does not include Agricultural Waste, Animal Waste, Ashes, Combustible Waste, Construction/Demolition Waste, Excavation Waste, Hazardous Waste, Industrial Waste, Liquid Waste, Metallic Waste, Recycling Waste, and Yard Waste.

- l) **“Liquid Waste”** shall mean sewage, sewage effluent, and sludge from septic tanks, holding tanks, and any recreational vehicle sewage system.
- m) **“Medical Waste”** shall mean any item or products used for medical treatments, including but not limited to, needles or dialysis tubing.
- n) **“Metallic Waste”** shall mean, but is not limited to, derelict vehicles, farm machinery, appliances, and any other items, goods or things that are comprised entirely or mostly of some type of metal substance or substances.
- o) **“Ozone Depleting Substance”** shall mean substances as regulated under The Ozone Depletion Substances Act.
- p) **“Recyclable Waste”** shall mean those wastes as listed in Schedule “B” to this By-Law, and as may be amended by the Council from time to time.
- q) **“Waste Oil”** shall mean oil, oil filters, oil containers, lubricants, grease, petroleum and like substances.
- r) **“Waste Tire”** shall mean tires discarded for reasons of wear or damage.
- s) **“Yard Waste”** shall mean leaves, grass clippings, garden and flower bed vegetation and straw.

4. REGULATIONS:

All persons disposing of waste at the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground shall do so in accordance with this By-law and regulations contained herein or as established by Council from time to time.

- a) No person, other than the Custodian as authorized, shall set or ignite any fire in the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground.
- b) No person shall dispose of the following Classes of Waste at the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Grounds:
 - I) Agricultural Waste
 - II) Animal Waste
 - III) Industrial Waste
 - IV) Hazardous Waste
 - V) Liquid Waste
 - VI) An Ozone Depleting Substance which has not been rendered safe as per the Ozone Depletion Substances Act.
 - VII) Bio-hazard Waste
- c) The following Classes of Waste may be disposed of at the Inwood Waste Transfer Station and the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station:
 - I) Ashes, provided said ashes are cold
 - II) Combustible Waste
 - III) Construction/Demolition Waste
 - IV) Landfill Waste
 - V) Metallic Waste
 - VI) Ozone Depleting Substance, provided the substance has rendered safe as per The Ozone Depletion Substances Act
 - VII) Recyclable Waste
 - VIII) Waste Tires

- IX) Yard Waste
 - X) Waste Oil at the Oil Recovery Centre located at the Inwood Waste Transfer Station and the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station.
- d) The following Classes of Waste may be disposed of at the Meleb Waste Disposal Grounds:
- I) Ashes, provided said ashes are cold
 - II) Combustible Waste
 - III) Construction/Demolition Waste
 - IV) Excavation Waste – Clean Fill
 - V) Excavation Waste - Rubble
 - VI) Landfill Waste
 - VII) Metallic Waste
 - VIII) Ozone Depleting Substance, provided the substance has rendered safe as per The Ozone Depletion Substances Act
 - IX) Recyclable Waste
 - X) Waste Tires
 - XI) Yard Waste
 - XII) Waste Oil at the Oil Recovery Centre located at the Meleb Waste Disposal Grounds.
- e) No waste will be accepted at the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station or the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground by the Waste Site Custodian other than from an owner or occupant of a residential, industrial and/or commercial establishment within the boundaries of the Armstrong Municipality and/or a municipal employee, as required; and No waste will be accepted by the Waste Site Custodian from a Commercial type Waste Collector unless said Collector directly contracted out by the Municipality of Armstrong.
- f) No person shall dispose of waste at the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station or the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground unless the waste was generated and collected from within the boundaries of the Municipality of Armstrong.
- g) All persons who attended the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground to dispose of waste shall separate their waste as per the Classes of Waste permitted for disposal at the Sites.
- h) All persons who attend the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Grounds shall report to the Custodian's Office and shall pay the applicable fee(s).
- i) All persons who attend the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Grounds shall dispose of allowable waste in such designated area or bins, as the case may be, and in such a manner as directed by the Waste Site Custodian.
- j) No person shall at any time deposit or dump any waste outside of the fence of the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Grounds but shall only dispose of waste in those areas or bins, as the case may be, as designated by the Waste Site Custodian.
- k) No person shall at any time deposit or dump any type of waste on any roadway, highway or bridge or any Municipality owned property that is outside of the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground designated dumping areas.
- l) It is unlawful for any person, other than the Custodian as authorized, to salvage, pick over, scatter, search, or burn any waste in the Inwood Waste Transfer

Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground unless said person has received prior written authorization from the Council of the RM of Armstrong.

- m) The Waste Site Custodian at the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground shall have complete authorization for the enforcement of the provisions of this By-Law, and authority to refuse permission to accept waste not in accordance with this By-Law.
- n) The Waste Disposal Custodians at the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground has the authority to ascertain the residential address of the waste contributor.
- o) The Waste Disposal Custodian at the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground is responsible for supervision of sorting or assisting in sorting of waste and recyclables into the proper classes/designated areas.
- p) It is the responsibility of the Waste Disposal Custodian at the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground to keep paper and/or debris cleared from entrances to the waste sites.
- q) The Municipality shall not be liable to any person for any damage howsoever caused to person or property or vehicle(s) while at the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station or the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground.

5. FEES:

All person who attend the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Grounds shall pay, at the time of attendance, the applicable fee for the disposal of the allowable waste as per the Class of Waste and Fees as set out in Schedule "A" attached hereto and forming a part of this By-law and as amended from time to time. All persons who pay the applicable fee shall receive a receipt from the Custodian as set out in Schedule "C".

6. PENALTIES:

- a) Any person who contravenes or refuses, neglects, omits, or fails to obey or observe any provision of this By-law is guilty of an offence and liable, upon summary conviction, in addition to costs, to a fine not exceeding FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00) or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding one (1) month, or both such fine and imprisonment.
- b) Where the contravention, refusal, neglect, omission, or failure, including failure to comply with a notice, order or direction given by the Council, continues for more than one occurrence, the person is guilty of a separate offence for each occurrence.

7. EFFECT

This By-law to No. 05/17 shall come into force and effect on the day it is passed.

WASTE DISPOSAL TIPPING FEES

ALL LOADS/BAGS ARE SUBJECT TO INSPECTION

NON-SORTED WASTE & CONSTRUCTION/DEMOLITION WASTE

Standard Size Garbage Bag	\$2.00 per bag
½ ton truck / utility trailer	\$20.00 per load
Single axle (one ton & up)	\$50.00 per load
Tandem or Trailer	\$100.00 per load
Semi-Trailer	\$200.00 per load
<u>SHINGLES</u>	\$60.00 per ½ ton truck
<u>MATTRESSES AND BOX SPRINGS</u>	\$20.00 per item recycling fee
<u>COUCHES</u>	\$10.00 per item
<u>SORTED WASTE</u>	No Charge and must be in clear bags

There is **NO CHARGE** for sorted household waste in clear bags.

<u>WASTE TIRES (any size)</u>	No Charge
<u>BURNING BARREL ASHES ONLY</u>	\$5.00

REFRIDGERATION SYSTEMS

Refrigerate systems that are not “Red Tagged” will be subject to a \$30.00 charge for draining of Freon, regardless of condition of heating coils.

<u>MEDICAL WASTE</u>	Not Accepted
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<u>EXCAVATION WASTE – CLEAN FILL</u>	No Charge
Only accepted at the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground	

<u>BURNABLE WASTE</u>	No Charge
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GARBAGE TRANSFERRED FROM INWOOD & CHATFIELD WASTE TRANSFER STATIONS TO THE MELEB WASTE DISPOSAL GROUND

Items such as construction debris and shingles placed in the waste bins at either of the Waste Transfer Stations, the fees will be doubled. Waste that can be brought to the Transfer Stations is limited to a ½ ton truck or utility trailer only of construction debris per household per day any larger loads will have to go directly to the Meleb Waste Disposal Grounds.

All loads must be tarped.

The Council of the Rural Municipality of Armstrong may, by resolution, delete, change or make additions to the Waste Disposal Tipping Fees of the Rural Municipality of Armstrong within Schedule “A” for the purposes of this by-law

RECYCLABLE WASTE

Recyclables are accepted at the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground.

- **Newspaper & Magazines:** place clean newspapers, inserts, phone books, magazines and catalogues shall be contained in clear bags or tied in bundles. No soiled papers.
- **Corrugated Cardboard:** shall be broken down, laid or folded flat and tied in bundles. No waxed or soiled boxes.
- **Boxboard and mixed household paper:** shall be cleaned of any food or liners and should be flattened or stuffed into a large box (to save space) for placing in appropriate container at recycling depot. Boxboard includes cereal, shoe and detergent boxes as well as rinsed milk and juice cartons, paper bags, sugar & flour bags, cardboard tubes, books (hardcover & paperback), egg cartons and other clean paper packaging. No drink boxes, tissue paper towel or laminated.
- **Clean Plastic Bags:** stuff clean, dry plastic bags into a plastic bag (other than green, orange or black garbage bags) tied shut for placing in appropriate container at recycling depot. Include rinsed milk pouches, grocery, bread, dry cleaning, frozen vegetable and blue newspaper bags as well as outer wrapper from toilet and hand tissues. Remove food residue, stickers and receipts. No meat, cheese or stretch wrap, cereal box liners or chip bags.
- **Glass Bottles and Jars:** remove and rinse caps and lids. Metal lids can be recycled with cans. Don't bag. Leave loose in depot containers. No other types of glass such as kitchenware, ceramics, dishes, drinking glasses, window glass, light bulbs or mirrors.
- **Metal Cans & Foil:** rinse cans. Place lids in a can, pinch closed and put loose in container at recycling depot. Do not put aluminium cans inside tin ones. Include clean aluminium foil and pie plates. No pots, cigarette or butter wrappers or scrap metal.
- **Plastic Containers:** discard tops and rinse containers for soft drinks, detergents, juice, bleach, shampoo, dairy products as well as clear and foam plastic cups, trays and packaging. Flatten soft drink containers and replace lids. All plastics with numbers on bottom are OK. No blister or bubble packs, prescription bottles or toys.
- **EMPTY Aerosol and Paint Cans:** make sure metal containers are empty. Take lids off of paint cans to let them dry, and place at designated area at waste site. Don't bag them. No containers with product or other hazardous waste.
- **Electronics:**
 - Computer Cables with or without connectors
 - Computer Cards such as sound, video, network, modems, controllers
 - Circuit Boards from computers, printers, fax and scanners
 - Internal or external CD-ROM's, DVD and CD-ROM Burners
 - Electronic typewriters
 - Fax machines
 - Hard disks and floppy drives
 - Laptops, laptop parts
 - Laptop accessories, chargers, batteries, cables and cards
 - External Modems
 - Networking Equipment, cards, hubs, routers, switches, cabling
 - Personal Computers (CPU, monitors, keyboards, mouse and peripherals)
 - Inkjet and Laser Printers
 - Software Manuals, CDs, DVDs and Diskettes
 - Cassette and reel-to-reel Tape players/recorders

Remote controls (television and stereo)
Games decks such as Play Station, X-box and Nintendo
Mobile (cell) phones, chargers and batteries
Pagers and answering machines
Regular telephones, corded or wireless
Stereos, Televisions, entertainment equipment
Batteries, dry-cell and rechargeable
Paper shredders
Fluorescent light bulbs, tube or compact
Humidifiers and furnaces
Appliances such as: stoves, microwaves, washers and dryers

- **Scrap Metals:** including aluminium and copper pipe.
- **Scrap Tires and Rims**
- **Propane Tanks**

OIL

- **Oil:** Waste oil, oil filters, oil containers, and antifreeze is to be dropped off at the ECO Centre. ECO Centres are located at the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground.

BURNABLES

- **Burnables:** Only separated and readily combustible materials such as boughs, leaves, loose straw, paper products, cardboard, non-salvageable untreated wood, and packing materials derived from wood may be burned. Items are to be placed in the designated burn cell areas located at the Inwood Waste Transfer Station, the Chatfield Waste Transfer Station and the Meleb Waste Disposal Ground. No burn barrel ashes are allowed in the burn cell area.

DOMESTIC WASTE

The following items of household waste are classified as Domestic Waste; to be placed in bins or in designated area directed by custodian.

- Meat Scraps
- Vegetable/fruit peels, egg shells, coffee/tea grounds
- Diapers, sanitary products, other contaminated paper products.
- Burn Barrel Ashes
- Styrofoam
- Shoes
- Toys
- Mattresses
- Couches
- Laminated and Treated Wood
